


Career Community Connections


Interest Groups Updates

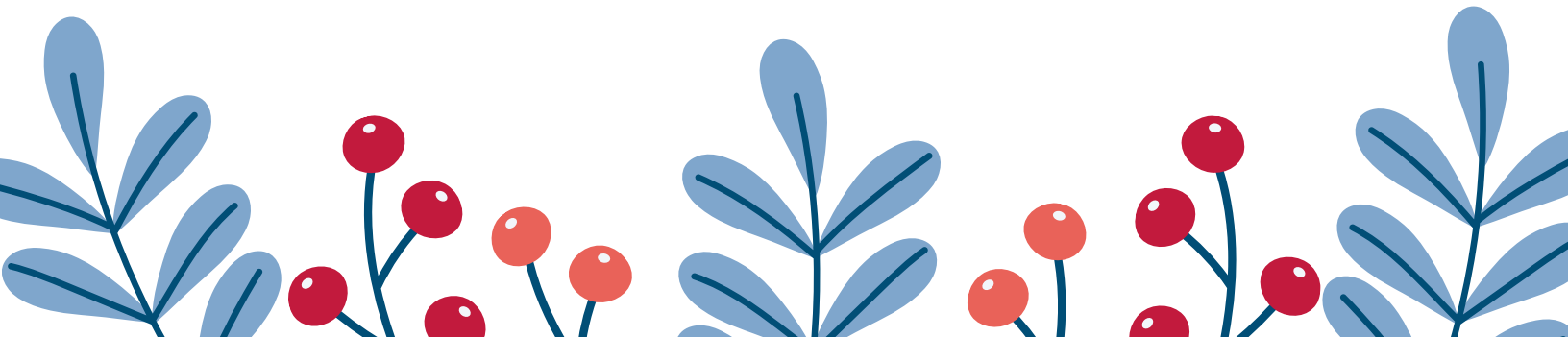
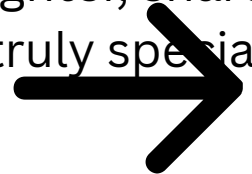
Message from the President
